# Shedd Free Library Board of Trustees Meeting December 7, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am by Chair Peggy Carney. Also present were Donna Stone, Sue Toczko, Lynn Hendrickson. Becky Dulac and Heidi Butcher.

### **Treasurer's Report:**

Lynn reported there is \$14,069.54 in checking, and \$42,552.56 in savings. We continue to operate within budget. The generator is in the process of being installed and the installation costs will come out of the library budget.

### Director's report:

Donna stated that evaluations have been completed. Donna mentioned again that the 2 computers available at the SFL see little use and she feels that laptops or Chrome Books would be more portable, user friendly, and might see more use by patrons. The Trustees asked her to research the cost (she had previously seen 2 at a Black Friday sale so the hope is similar pricing is still available.)

Donna thinks the current Birthday Book program for area children isn't effective since it doesn't seem to bring children and families into the library. She proposes a card with a certificate for a book that can be redeemed at the library as a way of bringing the children in. Currently the program serves around 48 children. The Trustees agreed this was a good approach.

The raffle baskets donated by an area patron are doing well. DVD loans continue to flourish but she suggests the loan time be reduced from 2 weeks to 1 (particularly with current new titles that are in demand.)

Donna has sent a survey out to the community that can be submitted anonymously but if patrons self identify they will be entered in a raffle. She has also added the Inter Library Loan System to the website so that patrons can reserve/request books themselves.

Mold remediation is scheduled for 12/11 and 12/12. The Libib interactive online book inventory has had a soft rollout and will formally debut in January.

There was a total of 7 overdue and unaccounted for books and those 7 titles have been purchased by a generous patron who wishes to remain anonymous. Thank you!

The meeting was adjourned at 9:55 am. Next meeting date to be determined.

### **Events/Programs**

- In November we continued posting/printing the monthly calendar.
- We held story hour each Tuesday with children attending each week.
- We tried Little Ones Get Together every other Saturday 11:30-12:00. It is not a big draw and we will need to create a more formal purpose for the group- possibly poems, songs or simple games. We will have to do more research on this.
- We have continued our weekly reading at the elementary school. Sue has been doing all of the readings because of new adult programming. We are on a rotating schedule K-1, 2-3, 4-5, and preschool.
- Our art exhibit for the month is quilted houses created by the Quilters Guild of which Sue Hoffstetter is a member.
- We hosted a book club discussion for the book The Book of Lost Names with 13
  participants. We do not have a book discussion for December but will host a book lovers
  potluck lunch on December 28th.
- We held our Good Deeds/Guest Reader event on Saturday 11/4. Emma the Dog and her owner Rudy Galdonik visited the library and we made dog treats to give to our patrons with dogs. We only had one child and one adult attend. It was still fun and our patrons loved the dog treats.
- Events that need revision include guest readers and the free tutoring.

## **Upcoming Events/Programs**

• The December Calendar has been distributed via print at the town hall and the post office and through facebook and our new website.

- We did not have a good turnout for our guest reader on 12/2 but we did receive two bags
  of hats, scarves, and mittens for the Coalition to End Homelessness. The monthly guest
  reader event will need to be revised. Our biggest turnout was for Lt. Dressel. We
  served pizza that day but that is a big expense.
- We have only two-story hours in December due to the work being done in the basement and the holiday. On each of those days, we will have a special guest. On 12/5 the Grinch will visit and on 12/19 Santa will visit.
- Splitting the story hour between the older and younger children seems to be working well. Sue and volunteer Paula Morse talk the younger children for an age-appropriate craft and I take the older students for games and crafts better suited for their age group.
- Our adult programming for December includes making Christmas- Santa's cookie plates, making Christmas Crew shirts, Lunch and Loop, our book lovers potluck lunch and a Breakfast Treat, Coffee and Conversation get together on 12/30.
- On December 19th I will be teaching a homeschool student how to crochet. If this goes well it may become a weekly event and may expand to other homeschoolers.
